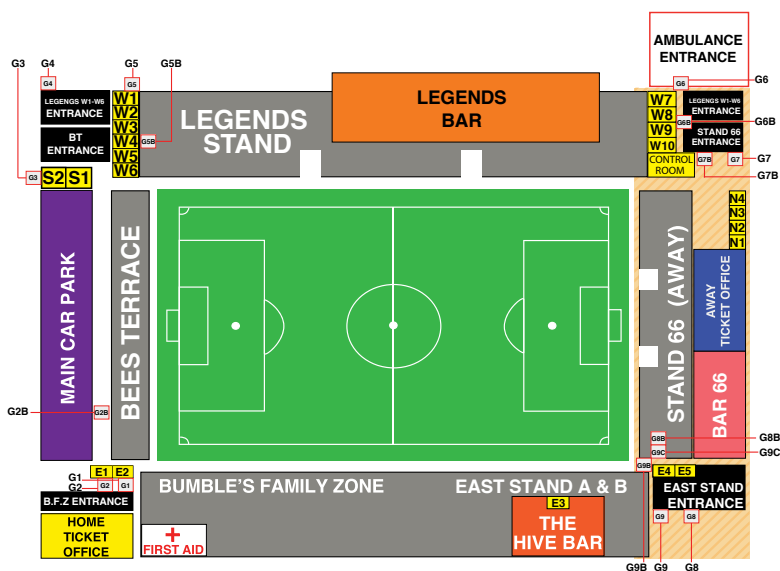

STADIUM HISTORY

The news that broke to the town on Wednesday, May 21, 1986 meant a move to a new stadium was becoming more of a reality. It was the first day of a new journey for United.

On Sunday, August 3, 1986, 33 councillors opted to vote for or against the planning application for Glanford Park.

The vote was narrowly cast in favour of the planning application. However, some councillors did not vote for or against the move, with the action result taking into consideration those who didn't. This saw the percentage fall below 50 per cent. However, as it was a majority from those who did vote, the decision stood.

The Scunthorpe Telegraph on January 30, 1987 donned the headline "APPROVED" with the Iron's new stadium finally accepted by the Glanford Borough planners. That didn't mean it was all go from that moment though, with the Secretary of State for the Environment still to have the final decision over the move amid the protests that were in place.

On its completion, it was the first new EFL stadium in England for 33 years since Southend United moved to Roots Hall in 1955.
NAMING...

The name Glanford Park was derived from its funding by the then Glanford Borough Council, before North Lincolnshire became a unitary authority.

The stadium opened its doors on Sunday, August 14, 1988 and brought gasps of disbelief from supporters, for generally speaking everyone was impressed with the product.

It was given Royal approval by the Princess Alexandra and her husband Angus Ogilvy, as a United side including Kevin Keegan (below) took on a star-studded Football League XI.

THE FIRST ENCOUNTER...

Scunthorpe United had to wait until Saturday, August 27, 1988 to introduce the new ground to league action as they played host to Hereford United.

At 2.55pm, Scunthorpe United filed out of the tunnel at Glanford Park, hoping to get off to a winning start in the new £2.5-million stadium. United played cautiously in the first half, making the fans wait until the second period for the first ever league goal at Glanford Park - Dave Cowling firing home on 47 minutes in a crowded penalty area.

The game finished 3-1 to the Iron, starting a new era in the perfect way, with victory and three points.

Floodlights were used for the first time on the following Tuesday evening as the Iron played host to Huddersfield Town in the League Cup. In another memorable game, the Iron twice come from behind to win 3-2.

THE CANTILEVER STAND (THAT NEVER MADE IT)...

Scunthorpe United and the Old Show Ground went down in history as the first football ground in England to have a cantilever stand, which was built in 1958 by the United Steel Structural Company.

One of the very early and original plans when moving to the new stadium, later to be named Glanford Park, was to move and incorporate the existing cantilever stand. This was seen as an artist's impression in the Scunthorpe Evening Telegraph very early on in plans for the new home. Attempts to move the stand eventually proved to be unfeasible and this was demolished along with the rest of the stadium - and there were no plans to create a brand new cantilever stand.

6 ANDREW BOYCE



Scunthorpe United confirmed the signing of centre-back Andrew Boyce following his departure from Eastleigh in June 2022.

He penned a two-year deal to return to the Iron and become first team manager Keith Hill's first signing of the summer.

Signing from Lincoln in 2014, Boyce made 37 appearances for United, including 33 during our 2014-15 League One season, scoring one goal.

While with us, the former Gainsborough man also had loan spells at Grimsby, Hartlepool and Notts County before making a permanent move to the first of those clubs in 2016.

The following year he joined Eastleigh and made 207 appearances in all competitions across five years, scoring nine times, before leaving this summer as he desired to play football nearer to his home in the north.

1 MARCUS DEWHURST



Scunthorpe United completed the signing of goalkeeper Marcus Dewhurst on a season-long loan basis from Sheffield United in July 2022.

He joined following a successful trial spell at Glanford Park.

Dewhurst has represented England at under 17, 18, 19 and 20 levels and made three appearances on loan at National League outfit Solihull Moors early last season. Previously, he also spent time on loan at Guiseley in 2019, where he appeared over 40 times in the National League North. He also made two appearances on loan at Carlisle United of League Two in 2020.

Last season he was mainly on loan at Boston United in the National League North, and made 35 appearances, reaching the play-off final for that division.

11 MARCUS CARVER



Scunthorpe United completed the signing of striker Marcus Carver from Hartlepool United for an undisclosed fee in August 2022.

A prolific forward in non-league, Blackburn-born Carver started his career with Accrington Stanley, making his debut in April 2012. Short-term loan spells at Marine, Halifax Town, and Barrow followed before the striker joined Chorley in 2015.

Carver was a key player for Chorley, notching 47 goals across four seasons, including 17 strikes in their promotion-winning season.

After leaving Chorley, Carver joined Southport and was one of the top scorers in the National League North last season with 17 strikes before joining the Pools in January.

9 JOE NUTTALL



Scunthorpe United completed the signing of striker Joe Nuttall from Championship side Blackpool on a permanent deal in January 2022.

A former Manchester City academy player, he made the move to Scotland and Aberdeen in 2015 before loan moves to Stranraer and Dumbarton.

He joined Blackburn Rovers in 2017 following a successful trial and scored eight times for the Ewood Park club's first team, while also being prolific in Premier League 2.

His form attracted the interest of Blackpool who he joined for an undisclosed fee in August 2019.

Nuttall netted four times for the Seaside in the 2019/20 season from 13 starts, including a late winner against Ipswich Town just before the season was suspended because of the COVID-19 pandemic. There was also a loan stint at Northampton Town.

The 2021-22 season saw him appear 16 times for the Iron, scoring twice.

CLASSIC ENCOUNTER WITH THE IRON

The Bees beat Scunthorpe United 3-0 at Underhill in a fourth-tier match on 17 October 1992, thanks to goals by Mark Carter, Derek Paine and Paul Showler. The final goal was a brilliantly worked gem.

Barnet were having a great season and went into the game in second in the table to York City, with 21 points from 10 games. They had only lost one league game.

Paul Showler's wing play gave the Iron problems all afternoon. On two occasions early on, he put in crosses for top scorer Gary Bull, but both times Bull's headers failed to test the Scunthorpe keeper Phil Whitehead. The keeper also kept out two headers from Dave Howell.

It was not until the 37th minute that Barnet took the lead. The Bees played a long ball forward from midway in their own half. Two Scunthorpe defenders tangled with one another on the edge of their own box in trying to clear the ball, leaving Mark Carter to control the ball, dink to his left and tuck it away left footed into the corner of the net.

In the second half, Jason White missed a golden opportunity to draw Scunthorpe level. White was one on one with Gary Phillips in the Bees' goal, but shot wide. However, from that point, Showler dazzled, putting the Iron on the back foot, even though not directly involved in the next goal.

In the 65th minute, Richard Huxford managed to get down the right-hand touchline, despite the attentions of two Scunthorpe defenders, and cross low to Carter on the edge of the six-yard box. Carter played the ball back and the ball came off a defender to Derek Payne on the penalty spot, who turned and fired home.

Barnet's third goal was a classic and came just a minute later. Showler, on the Barnet left, cut inside and then found Payne on the wing. Payne played the ball to Gary Bull inside the area, who passed first time to Showler, allowing the man who started the move to nick the ball past the onrushing Irons keeper.

Barnet nearly made it four towards the end, when a move involving eight players ended with substitute Jonathan Hunt firing straight at Whitehead.

The win saw the Bees keep their unbeaten home record. They finished third at the end of the season and so were automatically promoted to the third tier for their one and only season at that level. The Iron finished in mid-table.

HEAD TO HEAD WITH SCUNTHORPE UNITED

Barnet and Scunthorpe have not met for over 21 years. In fact, all 16 meetings were between the 1991/92 and 2000/01 seasons and all in the Football League. The teams have never yet met in a cup competition.

Honours are just about even in games between the teams overall, but Barnet have the upper hand in games at home, while the Iron have done better at Glanford Park, to where the club moved in 1988. All Barnet's home games against Scunthorpe until now have been at Underhill, with the Bees winning five, losing two and drawing one. In total (home and away), United have won seven and Barnet six, with three draws. The Iron have netted 21 goals and the Bees 20. There has never been a goalless draw to date.

Paul Wilson made most appearances (10) for Barnet against United, followed by Lee Harrison and Sam Stockley who both made six. Tony Cottee scored three goals, which is more than any other player for the Bees in games against the Iron. It was a hat-trick in the most recent game at Barnet, in December 2000. Mark Carter is the only other player to have scored more than one.

The most recent game between the sides was in March 2001, at Scunthorpe, with the Iron winning 2-1. Greg Heald scored the Barnet goal to put them in the lead, but Bjarni Larusson and Steve Torpey scored for the home side before half-time to win the game.

The Barnet team was: Lee Harrison, Sam Stockley, Rob Sawyers, Lee Flynn (Stuart Niven), Greg Heald, Mark Arber, John Doolan, Darren Currie, Warren Goodhind (Wayne Purser), Mark Gower (Danny Brown), Ben Strevens.

The best home attendance is 3,094 for the very first meeting in December 1991. However, the highest attendance for the fixture was 3,930 at Glanford Park in April 1999.

Gary Bull, who later represented the Iron, played for the Bees against United on four occasions in the Bees' first two seasons in the Football League. He made 210 appearances for Barnet and scored 117 goals. Later Bull turned out more than 30 times for Scunthorpe.

Others to play for both clubs (with dates at Barnet) include: Stev Angus (one game in 2007 and sent off), Neal Bishop (2007-09), Richard Brindley (2017-18, now at Notts County), Matt Carmichael (1994), Teddy Howe (2022), Ian Lawlor (2015-16), Ben May (2012), Michael Nelson (2015-18), Bondz N'Gala (2013-16), Krystian Pearce (2012), Dave Regis (1989-90), Gary Sargent (1976-82), Sam Togwell (2014-16), Curtis Weston (2012-18) and Josh Wright (2007-08).

Richard Brindley has also played for Bromley, last Tuesday's opponents, and Chelmsford City, who the Bees play next week.

ON THIS DAY

EIGHT YEARS AGO (2014)

Barnet beat Chelmsford City 4-1 in an FA Cup, fourth qualifying round replay. The first game had finished goalless at the Melbourne Stadium on the previous Saturday. In this replay, John Akinde, David Stephens and Curtis Weston put the Bees three ahead at the break. City got a goal back before Luisma Villa made the game safe. The attendance was 1,294. The Bees lost in the next round to Wycombe Wanderers. Barnet were in what is now the Vanarama National League, with Chelmsford in the league below, as they are today. The sides meet in the FA Cup again, this time in the first round proper, on Saturday 5 November.

14 YEARS AGO (2008)

The Bees drew 2-2 against Shrewsbury Town in the fourth tier at the New Meadow. John O'Flynn scored a brace in the first half, but the Shrews drew level before half time. The crowd was 5,163. Shrewsbury made the play-off final but lost to Gillingham, while Barnet finished 17th.

16 YEARS AGO (2006)

Barnet overcame Chester City 1-0 at Underhill in the fourth tier. Dean Sinclair scored the only goal, in the first half, in front of 2,301 spectators. The Bees finished in 14th and Chester in 18th.

22 YEARS AGO (2000)

Goals from Stuart Niven, Warren Goodhind, Omer Riza and Tony Richards, saw the Bees come back from three goals down after 26 minutes to win 4-3 at Underhill in the fourth tier. Despite having won more games than they had lost at this point in the season, the Bees slumped after Christmas and were relegated back to the National League for the first time. The attendance was 1,642.

27 YEARS AGO (1995)

The Bees won 2-0 against Northampton Town way in this fourth-tier match at Sixfields. Jamie Campbell and Mark Cooper scored Barnet's goals and the crowd was 5,376. The Bees finished the season in ninth, two places above the Cobblers.

50 YEARS AGO (1972)

Barnet beat Ramsgate 1-0 at home in the Southern League, Premier Division. The Bees finished the season in 13th, while Ramsgate were relegated. Dickie Plume scored the only goal, and the attendance was 1,157.

100 YEARS AGO (1922)

The Bees beat Enfield 2-1 away in the third qualifying round of the FA Amateur Cup. P Harding scored both goals. Barnet won again in the next round but went out to Nunhead in the first round proper.

AND CURRENTLY

Nicke Kabamba scored his 10th goal of the season in the last home game, against Maidenhead United, putting him fourth in the list of National League goalscorers this season. Nicke has now scored on more occasions for the Bees than for any club for whom he has played at Barnet's level or above.

In the Maidenhead game, Marvin Armstrong became the ninth Barnet player to score his debut goal for the club this season. It was Marvin's fourth appearance for the club, all as substitute. He started his first game at Bromley on Tuesday.

Rob Hall made his 50th appearance for the Bees against Bromley, having made his debut on 25 September 2021. Rob has made more appearances than any other current player, and has notched five goals to date.

Harry Pritchard's brace at Bromley was the sixth occasion that a Barnet player has achieved that feat this season, compared with five for the whole of last season.

Only three players have now played in every minute of every match this season: Laurie Taylor, Ben Wynter and Jerome Okimo. Dale Gorman, Nicke Kabamba and Harry Pritchard have also started every game.

The Bees have now scored in 12 consecutive first team competitive away matches, from 15 April 2022. They extended that run on Tuesday at Bromley. It is Barnet's best run since they scored in 17 consecutive away games between February and October 2016.

Barnet have now won three consecutive first team games, the first time for nearly a year. The Bees have also won their three most recent home games (including in the FA Cup two weeks ago), while Scunthorpe United have yet to win away this season. However, the Iron have only lost once in their last eight league games. Barnet have not lost on 28 October since 1987.

HI ALL, I'M SIMON BLACKBURN, NEWLY ELECTED MEMBER OF THE BFCSA.

For many years, Barnet FC were something of a plaything, something I'd toy with when not following another team from North London. I'd enjoyed many days at Underhill, before having something of an epiphany one Saturday. It wasn't the presence of Accrington Stanley, nor a particularly memorable performance, but the combination of all of the things that I had loved about the game, before it consumed itself, that led me to season tickets and a desperate bid to indoctrinate my daughter as a Bee.

I was very fortunate as a child; my Dad would take my brother and I to see football all over Hertfordshire, London and the surrounding area – Luton, Watford, Arsenal, Spurs, Orient, QPR... all in the era when you could pay on the gate. Over the last 26 years, as a teacher in Islington, Barnet, Harrow and Brent, I've paid close attention to the way that young football fans identify with their chosen teams. Because of the way we are fed football in the 21st century, and because it is impossible for youngsters to turn up to top flight football matches on a whim, not least because of the cost, fewer and fewer teenagers associate 'supporting' a football team with actually attending that team's games in person.

Look round the area, and you'll see an increasing number of Paris St. Germain and Bayern Munich shirts. What if these youngsters had the opportunity to follow a local team, a professional team, to get involved in the matchday experience? What if they could see local kids like themselves turn out at 3pm on a Saturday? I have been fortunate enough to have the opportunity to see two former pupils of Ravenscroft School, the school around the corner from what was Underhill, turn out for the Bees many times. Mauro Vilhete was still at Ravenscroft when he joined the club, and when David Tutonda made his debut in January 201, many Ravens pupils came to watch him; some stayed beyond that game.

North-West London is a fertile ground for football, and Barnet FC is in a position to take advantage of this. Given that the excellent public transport links make The Hive entirely accessible, and the fact that the tickets for youngsters are very reasonably priced, the club and us, as supporters, should do all we can to spread the word, to make the club central to the community in which it resides.
