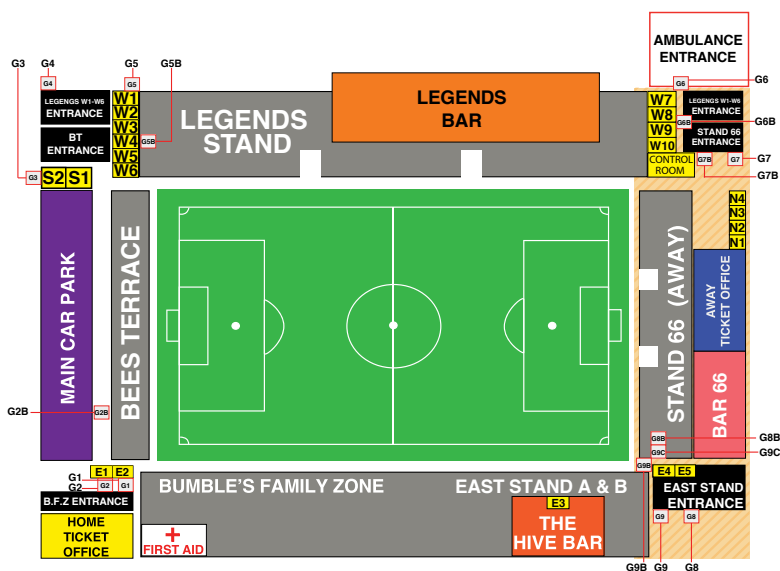

**The National League action resumed at The Hive with derby day against Wealdstone, Dean Brennan starts with an unchanged line-up from Saturday's FA Cup tie against Accrington.**

It was a lively start to the game. The first big opportunity of the game came from a Barnet counterattack. The ball was collected in the middle of the field by Idris Kanu, he laid it off to Sam Beard, who finds Ben Wynter who is unable to keep the ball down as it flies over the bar. It wouldn't have counted since the flag went up for offside.

The Bees were on the attack again, the cross goes across the face of the goal and finds Kanu who heads it straight at the goalkeeper. Kanu wins a foul and Nicke Kabamba sees the run of Harry Pritchard who hits his shot around the goalkeeper into the back of the net. Wealdstone was completely caught off guard by the Bees.

With a free-kick won right side of the box, Wealdstone had a great opportunity to score, but the ball went straight into the wall. There was great chance for Barnet to double their lead from a corner. Kanu whips the ball in and Pritchard gets to it first, but his header is blocked by a Wealdstone defender. Kanu picks the ball up from the edge of our box and finds the run of Kabamba but the keepers come out to head the ball. The keeper did not clear it far enough as Wynter picks the ball from halfway and tries the long range shot but it lands over the bar.

Barnet have having the best chances. It is late in the first half when a corner kick comes in. Kabamba wins the ball, but the defender knocks the wind out of it, and the Wealdstone goalkeeper reaches it. In added time, Walker is called into action. Walker gets down quickly to save a long range shot from outside the box going into the bottom left corner.

## HALF TIME: Barnet 1-0 Wealdstone

Barnet replaced Kanu with Marvin Armstrong before the second half began. There was shouting for a handball from the home side, but the ref wasn't interested. Pritchard attempts to drive the ball from range, but it did not appear to be a threat.

The Bees doubled the lead on the hour mark. A long ball from the goal kick caused trouble for Wealdstone as they struggle to clear it. Armstrong gets the ball and taps it past the keeper, who brings him down. Ref plays advantage because the ball falls to Kabamba and he just passes the ball into the net.

Walker produces a world class save. The ball falls to a Wealdstone strike and is flicked at close range. Walker gets a hand on the ball with some insane reaction time. It was an excellent opportunity for Ryan De Havilland to get on the scoreboard today. From a freekick, he hits the ball well, but Wealdstone's keeper tips it over for a corner.



As the ref blows his whistle for the final time, Barnet extends their impressive run of victories in the league to four.

## The Timeline

### 1980 – 1990

The club was originally formed in 1988 by Stuart Cadmore when a group of players left the youth team Plymouth Kolts and joined the Plymouth & District League in Division 4. In that same year the club secured sponsorship from Exeter Airport, and as part of that deal they changed their name to Ex-Air Flyers. They were the first club in Plymouth to be sponsored from outside the city limits. The club colours of yellow and blue are from the colours of the airport logo and remain the same today.

In their first season the club gained promotion and then moved the Parkway Sports Club.

### 1990 – 2000

The club carried on to be promoted in successive seasons until it reached Division one and was waiting to join the Premier Division when the Devon League was formed in 1992. The club decided to apply to become members of the Devon League instead as the Parkway Sports Club had sufficient facilities to join the league. The club was accepted into the league but the club had to change its name so they become known as EAF Plymouth FC.

Before the 1993–94 season the Sports Club offered a number of extra facilities and help to the club, so the club changed their name to Plymouth Parkway FC. Five seasons later in 1998 the club left the Devon league to join the South Western League.

### 2000 – 2010

On the eve of the 2000–01 season the club became homeless with the loss of the Parkway Sports Club due to a disagreement over the terms of the lease and subsequent maintenance costs. As a result, and with special permission from the league, the club spent that season having to play all of its games away from home. During their build up to the 2001/02 season the club announced they would be developing an area of Manadon as their new ground, to be known as Bolitho Park. While work was being completed, with controversial assistance from Plymouth City Council, they used The Brickfields athletics ground in Devonport, before they moved to their new and current home in August 2003.

In the 2006–07 season the club entered the FA Vase for the first time, making it to the second qualifying round in their first attempt. A season later the club became founding members of the South West Peninsula League, when the South Western Football League and the Devon County Football League merged.

### 2010 – 2020

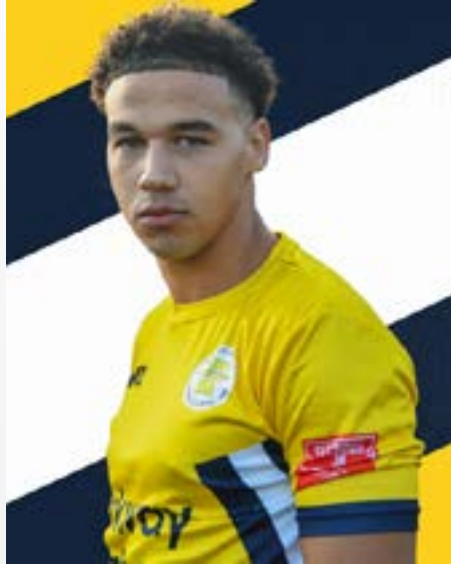
The identity of the football club has been built on the drive to improve and progress on and off the pitch! Having spent nearly 20 years in the South Western leagues, at the end of the 2015/16 campaign the club's officials decided that they wanted to put a plan together to move even further up the football pyramid. In order to achieve that goal, it was identified that Plymouth Parkway as a business were missing a few things. Subsequently, it was a busy summer before the 2016/17 season – the result of which Plymouth Parkway merged with another ambitious Plymouth football club formally named as Bar Sol Ona! Bar Sol Ona, who were challenging for promotion in the Plymouth and District Premier Division at the time, became Plymouth Parkway's reserve team and moved to the East Cornwall Premier League Division One. Their under 18's became Plymouth Parkway's under 18's.

The merger and the new faces brought with it a fresh drive and ambition for the club to progress – not to mention stronger financial capabilities. The six members of the board made their intentions known immediately by applying for promotion to the Toolstation Western Football League.

Following an outstanding season in 2017-18 which saw Plymouth Parkway promoted as League Champions of the SWPL, losing just one game during the season.

2018/2019 was another fantastic season for Parkway, which commenced their first campaign within the Western League. The season proved to be nearly as good as the previous year, as we finished runners up in the League and Devon St Luke's Bowl but winning the coveted Les Phillips League Cup.

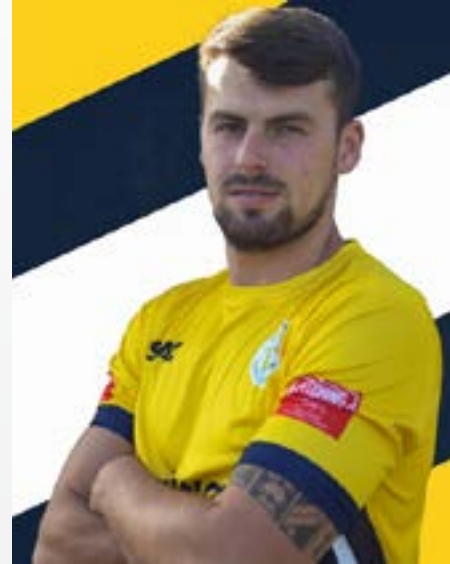
# 4 AUSTEN BOOTH

Austen enjoyed a happy spell with the club many years ago and will look to enjoy his second spell with Parkway as they move into the Southern Premier League.

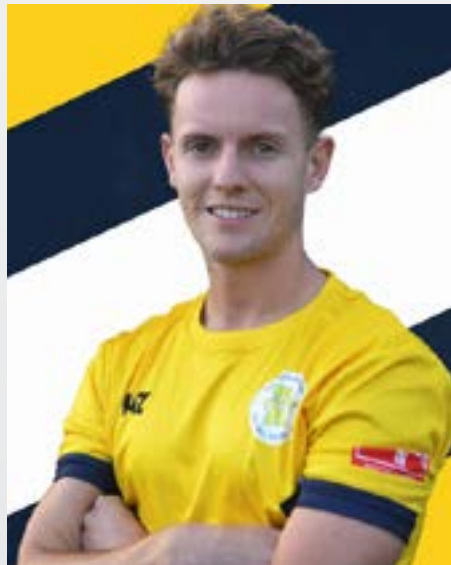
# 8 BILLY PALFREY

# BARNET'S PURSUIT OF THE FA TROPHY

**This is the 54th season that the FA Trophy has been run and it is the 33rd time that Barnet have competed in the competition. They could not take part when they were in the Football League.**

The Bees' most successful season was in 1971/72, when they reached the final for the one and only time. Automatic promotion to the Football League was not introduced until 1986/87 and, until then, winning the Trophy was the pinnacle of their ambition for the eligible non-league clubs.

Across the 32 previous campaigns in the Trophy, Barnet have played 94 games (compared with 316 games in the FA Cup). Disregarding replays, Barnet have played 71 ties, coming out as victors on 40 occasions (including one game in 2003/04 when the Bees were subsequently expelled from the competition for playing an ineligible substitute). They have been drawn at home 35 times (including for today's game) and drawn away on 34 occasions. Due to a total of 23 replays (18 first replays, four second replays and one third replay, which was against Runcorn), before today Barnet have actually played 46 games at home (10 at The Hive London), 43 away and five matches on a neutral ground (two second replays, two semi-finals and, of course, the final at Wembley).

Barnet have reached the quarter-finals on six occasions. They have gone on to reach the semi-final twice, both in the first three years that the competition was run. In the very first year of the competition, 1969/70, the Bees played in six rounds, beating Rushden Town, Bath City (fighting back from 3-0 down to win 4-3), Hereford United, Bromsgrove

Rovers and Mossley in the quarter-final. In the quarter-final against Mossley, Barnet played with a ferocious wind at their backs in the first period and were 2-1 ahead by half-time.

It seemed the odds would be against the Bees for the second period, but the wind dropped, and Barnet ran out winners by 8-1, which had seemed unlikely at half-time. That set up a semi-final at Stoke City's Victoria Ground. Leading goalscorer Les Eason had been injured a few days earlier. He played in the semi-final, but was not really fit, and the Bees lost 1-0 to Macclesfield Town.

Two seasons later (1971/72), Barnet played a total of seven games (including one replay) to reach the final. Victories over Kidderminster Harriers, Dover, Lowestoft Town, Wigan Athletic, Dartford and Telford United saw the Bees through to face Stafford Rangers in the final. The 2-1 win over Wigan was especially memorable, as the Latics missed two penalties, then went ahead, but saw Colin Flatt score twice for the Bees in the final 15 minutes. The semi-final against Telford was played at Northampton Town's County Ground and a Dickie Plume penalty was the only goal of a tense affair. The final was at the old Wembley and was a huge disappointment, with the Bees never really playing the football of which they were capable. They held Stafford until half-time, but conceded three times in eight second-half minutes (for more on this Trophy campaign and the final, see the article in the Barnet v Solihull Moors programme last season on 9 April 2022, which marked the 50th anniversary of Barnet's last appearance at Wembley to date).

Since reaching the final at Wembley, Barnet have made the quarter-finals four times. This was achieved in 1983/84 (losing to a strong Northwich Victoria team who were above them in the league); in 1986/87 (losing disappointingly to Fareham Town); in 2018/19 (going out agonisingly to eventual winners AFC Fylde away on penalties); and in 2019/20 (losing at home to Halesowen Town, a side from three levels below the Bees).

The past two seasons have seen Barnet fall at the first hurdle, to Dorking Wanderers and most recently Boreham Wood, though the Bees played exceptionally well in the latter game. The highest crowd for a Barnet game in the Trophy was naturally the 24,000 recorded attendance for the Wembley final. The two semi-finals attracted crowds of 7,855 and 4,481.

The largest attendance at home is 2,920 in 1969/70 for the game against Mossley, while the largest away on an opponent's ground is 4,830 for the game at Wigan Athletic in 1971/72. The highest at The Hive London is 1,483 for the quarter-final in 2019/20 against Halesowen Town.

The biggest win (and the highest scoring game) was the 8-1 victory against Mossley in 1969/70. Two games have been decided on penalties and the Bees have lost both: against Scarborough in 2001/02 and the quarter-final against AFC Fylde in 2018/19. Penalties are very likely this season as, prior to the final, there will be no replays and no extra time, with spot kicks deciding the outcome

after 90 minutes.

The Bees have played Wealdstone five times in the Trophy, more often than any other team, though three of those games were replays.

# ON THIS DAY

### **EIGHT years ago (2014)**

Barnet beat Chester 3-0 at The Hive London in what is now the National League, with goals by John Akinde, Charlie MacDonald and Curtis Weston. The attendance was 1,946. It was the first double for the Bees that season, having beaten the Seals 5-0 away on the first day of the season. Barnet went on to win the league and gain promotion back to the Football League.

### **14 years ago (2008)**

The Bees held Darlington to a 2-2 draw away in the fourth tier. Ex-Bee Liam Hatch, who was on loan at Darlington from Peterborough United, put the Quakers ahead twice, but Barnet equalised first through John O'Flynn and then Ismail Yakubu. The crowd was 2,770. The Bees finished the season in 17th.

### **19 years ago (2003)**

Farnborough Town beat Barnet 2-0 at Underhill in the National League, watched by a crowd of 1,547. The Bees finished the season in the play-off places, but lost to Shrewsbury Town over two legs on penalties in the semi-final.

### **36 years ago (1986)**

Barnet beat Wokingham Town 6-0 in the FA Trophy, first round, at Underhill. The Bees' goals were scored by Nicky Evans (a hat-trick), John Margerrison, Steve Mahoney and Gary Roberts, and the attendance was 682. Barnet eventually went out, three rounds later, in the quarter-finals, to Fareham Town.

### **47 years ago (1975)**

The Bees beat Kidderminster Harriers 2-1 at Aggborough Stadium in the Southern League, Division 1 North. Gary Williams and Billy Meadows scored for the Bees. The attendance was 297. Barnet finished the season in ninth.

### **41 years ago (1969)**

Chelmsford City beat Barnet 2-0 in the Southern League Premier Division, at New Writtle Street. The crowd was 1,239. Barnet finished the season in seventh.

### **75 years ago (1947)**

The Bees beat Redhill 2-1 at Underhill in the Athenian League. The scorers were Dennis Kelleher and Lester Finch, who are both ranked in Barnet's top 10 goalscorers of all time. It was Finch's 20th and final season playing for the Bees, though he went on to manage the team. The Bees ended that season as champions and reached the FA Amateur Cup final, losing to Leytonstone 1-0 at Stamford Bridge.

### **AND CURRENTLY**

After beating Wealdstone at home in their most recent game, Barnet have now won four consecutive league games and without conceding a goal. That is the first time they have achieved that feat for more than 20 years; in fact, since March 2002.

The most recent occasion that Barnet kept four consecutive clean sheets in league games (but did not win all the games) was in March/April 2019. Barnet last won four consecutive league games (but did concede) in August/September 2018. Currently, the Bees have not lost a league game or conceded a goal in the league since 1 November.

Having scored against Wealdstone, Nicke Kabamba now has 11 goals for the season, all in the league. That puts him fourth equal top goalscorer in the Vanarama National League, according to the BBC. Having also scored against Wealdstone, Harry Pritchard is now on eight goals, putting him equal 14th.

The win against Wealdstone was the first time that the Bees had beaten the Stones since 1988, though there had only been four intervening games. It was also the highest home attendance (2,494) for this local derby for well over 50 years.

So far this season, Jerome Okimo, Laurie Walker and Ben Wynter have played every minute of every first team game. Nicke Kabamba and Harry Pritchard have also started every game.

Barnet have never previously played Plymouth Parkway. Having started in the third and final qualifying round, Plymouth Parkway have reached this third round proper by beating Dorchester Town at home, Bristol Manor Farm at home, and Oxford City away, on penalties. It is only the second season the club has played in the FA Trophy, and they reached the fourth round proper last season, having started in the second qualifying round. Prior to 2021/22, Plymouth Parkway competed in the FA Vase, before being promoted from the Western League, first to the Southern League Division 1 South and then to the Southern League Premier Division South. Today is the first time Plymouth Parkway have played a National League team in the FA Cup or the FA Trophy. Plymouth Parkway are the fifth club Barnet have played from Devon in their history. The others are Exeter City, Plymouth Argyle, Tiverton Town and Torquay United.

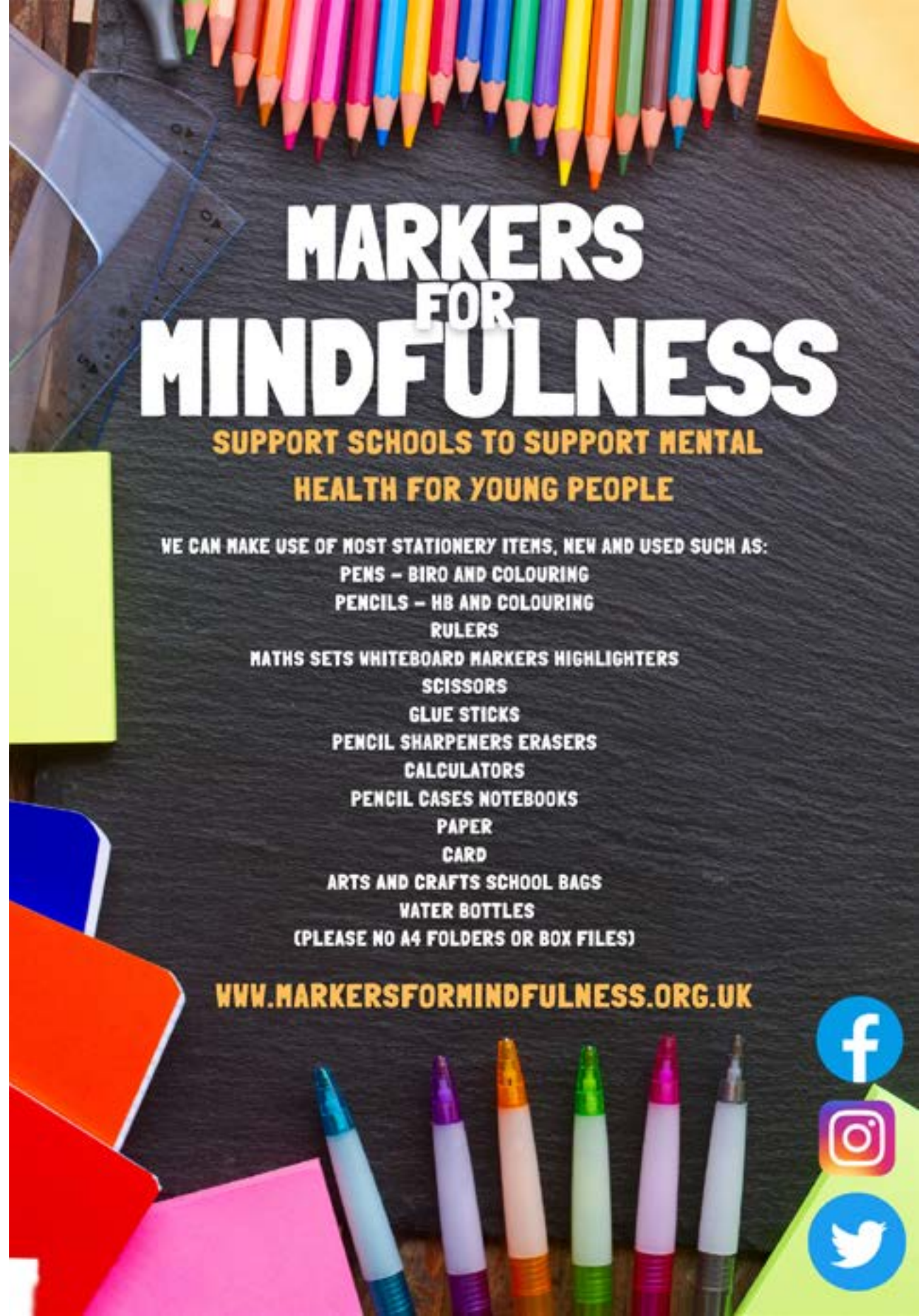
