An in-swinging corner in the 12th minute from the visitors found Regan Ogle who headed across goal, but no one could get a touch at the back post as the ball went wide of the post.

After some close end to end play the next big chance of the game came to Barnet again in the 21st minute when the home side had a good passage of build-up play with the ball making its way to Ryan Glover on the edge of the box.

Glover then played a pass through to Bailey Hobson who found his way in behind the defence, but Mathew Hudson in the Oldham goal quickly came off his line to close down the angle and make a 1v1 save to keep the scores level.

Barnet continued to have the more clear-cut chances of the first half when Ben Coker put in a low cross in the 34th minute that found Idris Kanu in the box and his first time effort went firing over the crossbar.

### **Half Time 0-0**

The second half started quicker than the first when Barnet had a counterattack in the 49th minute that found Baily Hobson up the pitch who managed to carry his run into the box then finding a pass to Ryan Glover who hit the ball first time over the bar.

After that chance for the bees not many opportunities came for either side as both teams tried not to give away too much. But in the 72nd minute that changed when Myles Kenlock played a pass into Ben Coker who found his way in behind the defence, the fullback slotted the ball past the keeper, but the potential go ahead goal was ruled out for offside.

After continued pressure from the home side the ball found its way out to Anthony Hartigan on the edge of the box in the 82nd minute and the midfielder had a shot towards goal that crashed off the crossbar then cleared away by the away side.

# Match Report

## Barnet 0-0 Oldham Athletic

**The first chance of the game came in the 4th minute when a cross from Ben Coker on the left-hand side found Forward Nicke Kabamba at the back post where his contested header goes just wide of the near post.**

Just a couple minutes later Rhys Browne turned his defender and had a shot at goal forcing a full stretch save from Mathew Hudson in the Oldham goal to keep the deadlock.

As the clock ticked down to the final whistle the home side tried to find a winner and in the 90th minute and in-swinging corner from captain Anthony Hartigan was flicked on at the near post by Joe Grimwood but an Oldham defender who was at the back post managed to clear the ball away.

That was the last big chance for either side as both teams played out a stalemate 0-0 draw.

We were back on the road last Saturday as we headed to Dagenham. With a history of high scoring games at Victoria Road, I was nervous at what the day would have in store! Before any football though, I had the task of getting over to East London. It always feels like such a long journey but after a couple of tubes and a train from Fenchurch Street, I was in Upminster for around 12:30pm where a few of us were meeting in a lovely little tap room. After a couple of drinks, we got taxis to the ground where we took our place in the crowded away end ready for kick-off.

Before we had even sat down there was a goal in the game but unfortunately, it was the hosts who took the lead when the Daggers found a gap in our defence. We replied almost instantly though making it level in the 4th minute after a shot from Idris Kanu into the bottom corner. The game settled down after the early goals and we found ourselves having plenty of possession but struggled to use it effectively. As a result, it was Dagenham who got the next goal in the 34th minute making it 2-1 at half-time. We made a change during the break introducing Callum Stead for Zak Brunt in the hope that we could get back into the game in the second 45. However, it seemed unlikely just three minutes into the half when Dagenham scored again with Ryan Hill hitting a strike into the top corner. In the 65th minute, there was a chance to get back into it when we were awarded a penalty following a foul on Bailey Hobson. Nicke Kabamba stepped up in front of the away end and confidently put away the penalty before running back to the centre circle ready to search for a way back into the game. Just two minutes later we were awarded another penalty, this time for a foul Myles Kenlock. Kabamba stepped up again and replicated his first penalty to make it level at 3-3. After this, we were hungry for more and were rewarded for our efforts in the 77th minute when Rhys Browne scored with a shot from the edge of the box after coming on as a substitute. The away end was buzzing! The final 13 minutes before seven of added time were nervy with the Dagenham goalkeeper even going up to try and aid his side's efforts to get back into the game. But the referee blew the whistle before any more goals were scored giving us a 4-3 win and three points.

The boys came over to the 532 travelling Bees fans who were in great spirits after being in good voice all afternoon. We all made our way out of the stadium and headed to the nearby Dagenham East tube station, just manging to squeeze on to the crowded tube to head back into London. A couple of us were heading to Brixton for a gig and thankfully we were in very good spirits for the evening after an excellent win from the lads. Dagenham lived up to its high scoring expectation again, but it felt good to be on the right side of the result this season!

The hosts took a very early lead after just 13 seconds when a long ball forward down the left-hand side was swung into the box and there was Josh Umerah to place the ball past Nick Hayes and into the net.

In a lightning start to this contest the Bees had the equaliser after just three minutes when a cross was flung into the path of Idris Kanu who poked the ball past Elliot Justham to bring the scores level.

The game settled down as the minutes went on, the next chance of note came in the 25th minute when Idris Kanu tried his luck from the edge of the box, but his shot was deflected past the post.

Ryan Glover with some neat footwork allowed his to feed the ball to Bailey Hobson in a shooting position but his shot was well blocked and cleared away by the hosts.

Against the run of play Dagenham had the lead again in the 34th minute when the ball was played around the box before it fell to Romoney Critchlow in the six-yard

box who tapped home.

### **Half Time 2-1**

Two minutes into the second half and Dagenham added a third when an advancing run down the right-hand was played to Ryan Hill who smashed the ball into the top corner leaving Hayes with no chance.

Despite the third goal Barnet were still bringing the press and came close again when Glover's cross met Nicke Kabamba in the box who fired his shot wide of the mark.

Barnet were handed a lifeline when Bailey Hobson was tripped in the box just past the hour mark. Nicke Kabamba stepped up and placed the ball down the middle of the goal to get one back. Just three minutes later and the Bees were handed a golden chance to level the game up. Myles Kenlock was clipped when running into the box. Kabamba stepped up for a second time to bring the scores level.

# Match Report

## Dag & Red 3-4 Barnet

**The Bees registered a dramatic win away to Dagenham on Saturday afternoon in a game filled with drama.**

The turnaround was complete when substitute Rhys Browne received the ball just outside the box before launching an effort at goal, beating Justham.

Barnet came inches away from making it five when Ryan Glover saw a header from inside the box well saved by the Dagenham keeper.

Kabamba was unlucky to not get his hat-trick when he got on the end of a Kanu cross but he wasn't able to find the connection on the ball he was looking for as his shot was cleared away.

Dagenham would have felt hard done by in the final moments when a free kick played in met the diving header of keeper Justham who saw his effort well saved by Hayes before the rebound rattled the crossbar.

# Club History

**Woking Football Club, known as the Cards (from the Cardinal red of the red and white halves), was formed in 1887. The Club joined the West Surrey League in 1895/96, winning the title by one point on the final day of the season. However, within 21 years of being formed, the Club was in danger of folding for financial reasons.**

The turning point came when, in January 1908, Woking played Bolton Wanderers in the First Round of the FA Cup, having battled through five qualifying rounds. Despite losing the away game 5-0, the Club made it into the national press.

Bolton Wanderers, impressed by the minnows they had defeated, travelled to Woking for a friendly match the following season, which kept the Club solvent.

In 1911 the Club joined the Isthmian League, maintaining their place in the top division for 72 years and finishing as runners-up to Wycombe Wanderers in 1956/57. That achievement was eclipsed the following season when, in front of a 71,000 crowd, the Cards beat Ilford 3-0 in the last FA Amateur Cup Final to be televised live. Sadly, the Club then went into decline, culminating in a first-ever relegation in 1982/83. By the end of the 1984/85 season the Club had plunged to Division Two South of the Isthmian League. It was during that season that former player, Geoff Chapple, was appointed as manager.

Although he was not able to save the Club from relegation, the renaissance was underway. Just missing out on promotion at the first attempt, the Club clinched the Division Two South title in 1986/87 and, after two third place finishes in Division One, they were promoted back to the Premier Division at the end of the 1989/90 season.

The 2002/03 season saw the Club get off to its best-ever start in the Conference. However, 'black September' brought seven consecutive defeats and a rapid descent into the relegation zone. Geoff Chapple resigned and Glenn Cockerill took over as manager, initially on a temporary basis. After an incredible sequence of results – winning and losing alternate games in a run

of 12 matches and then embarking on nine consecutive draws – it all turned on the last day of the season. Woking went into the final game second from bottom, knowing that even a win over Telford would not guarantee their Conference status for 2003/04. However, a convincing 3-0 win for the Cards, plus victories by arch rivals Stevenage Borough, at home to Southport, and Farnborough Town, away to Nuneaton Borough, ensured relegation for those two defeated clubs and a massive sigh of relief around Kingfield.

The Club went full-time in the summer of 2003. The fans' hopes were borne out by a much better season, with the Cards achieving a ninth place finish, having been on the fringe of the play-off places until the last few weeks. Again, only a poor finish the following season deprived the Cards of a play-off place, but a final placing of 8th with 68 points was the best achievement since 1997/98.

Disappointingly, the Cards failed to mount a challenge for a play-off place in 2005/06, finishing in 11th place. But they made the most of favourable draws in the FA Trophy, reaching the Final at Upton Park, only to lose 2-0 to Grays Athletic. 2006/07 was another season of underachieving and, despite bringing in fresh faces during the January transfer window, Glenn Cockerill was unable to turn around a poor run of results and left Kingfield at the end of March, with relegation a distinct threat. Graham Baker and Club Captain Neil Smith took over for the final six games and steered the Cards to a safe 15th place.

# HEAD 2 HEAD

with Woking

**Barnet and Woking have met one another 35 times and, extraordinarily, 16 games have been drawn. The Bees have won 10 games and the Cards nine. The first encounter was in 1949/50. Prior to 2000, all the games were in the FA Cup, FA Trophy or FA Amateur Cup.**

Since that date, all the games have been in what is now the Vanarama National League, with Barnet winning seven, Woking five, and 10 ending in draws.

There have been 16 Barnet home games in all competitions, with the Bees winning six, the Cards three and seven ending all square. In those home games, Barnet have scored 28 goals and Woking 22. Seven matches have been at The Hive London, while nine games were at Underhill. There have been 16 games at Woking and three cup games played on a neutral ground (two at Brentford and one at Fulham): an Amateur Cup semi-final and the replay in 1957/58, and a second replay in an FA Cup first round tie in 1978/79 (in the days before penalty shoot-outs).

Wayne Purser and Ben Strevens are the only Barnet players to have scored three times against the Cards. The largest attendance for a game between the Bees and the Cards was 20,750 for the Amateur Cup semi-final in 1958 at Fulham (Barnet won the replay a week later in front of another bumper crowd). The highest attendance at Underhill (where records are available) was 4,430 in 1949/50. In National League games, the highest attendances have been 3,069 at Woking in 2023, and 2,036 at The Hive London in 2015.

Last season, Barnet won 2-0 at home in August, thanks to two Zak Brunt goals, one in each half. The Cards won the return at the Kingfield Stadium in March, with Kevin Berkoe netting the only goal. The two teams for the most recent game were:

More than 30 players have played for both clubs. Of the current Barnet squad, Rhys Browne, Nicke Kabamba and Mark Shelton have also played for the Cards. Nicke played against Barnet once in 2021/22, while on loan at Woking, and has played against the Cards four times in the past two seasons. Rhys joined from Woking in the close season and has played for the Cards against the Bees twice, scoring once. Mark played once for Woking against Barnet and scored. Of the current Woking squad, Dale Gorman and Ben Wynter played for the Bees for the past two seasons and both made four appearances against Woking, while ex-Bee Reece Grego-Cox is also at Woking, though he is on a season-long loan to Dagenham & Redbridge. In addition to Nicke Kabamba, Moussa Diarra, now at Eastbourne, played for both teams in this fixture. Moussa represented Woking against Barnet four times between 2020 and 2022, scoring three times. He played for the Bees against the Cards once, in 2022.

Others to play for both teams include (with dates at Barnet): Tom Champion (2004-05 and again 2014-16), Jake Cole (2009-11), Sean Devine (1995-99), Inih Effiong (2020-21), Phil Gridelet (1989-90), Carl Hoddle (1986-87 and 1991-95), Billy Holmes (1974-75 and 1982), Jake Hyde (2009-10 and 2012-14), Micah Hyde (2009-10), Nicky Nicolau (2006-09), Jason Norville (2005-07), Jon Nurse (2012-15), Josh Payne (2021-22), Craig Ross (2017-18, and played for the Cards seven times against the Bees), Dave Tarpey (2017-19), Harry Taylor (2014-22, on loan to the Cards in 2019) and Ismail Yakubu (2002-10).

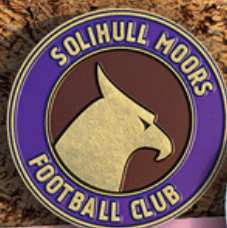

# On this day

## Five years ago (2019)

Barnet lost 2-1 to top-of-the-table Barrow at Holker Street in the Vanarama National League. The Bluebirds were two ahead after 30 minutes, but a Jack Taylor goal in the 85th minute made the scoreline respectable. The crowd was 2,120. It was Barnet's fifth loss in six games, dropping to 16th position after the match. Manager Darren Currie spoke to the disappointed fans on the terraces at the end. However, this loss was followed by a 12-match unbeaten run that helped the Bees to a play-off place at the end of the season. Barnet lost in the play-off semi-final to Notts County with no fans admitted due to Covid. Barrow were

## 11 years ago (2013)

Grimsby Town beat the Bees 2-1 at Blundell Park in what is now the National League. All the goals came in the second half, with David Stephens' goal for Barnet being the last. The attendance was 3,441. The Mariners made the play-offs, but not the final, while the Bees were eighth (needing a top-five finish for the play-offs at that time). The following season they were champions.

## 14 years ago (2010)

Gillingham overcame Barnet 2-1 at Underhill in League Two. Kevin Gallen put the Bees ahead in the first half with his only goal for the club in nine appearances. The gate was 2,519, with nearly half supporting Gillingham. At the end of the season, the Gills missed play-offs by a whisker and at the other end of the table Barnet missed relegation by a similar amount.

## 22 years ago (2002)

The Bees beat Forest Green Rovers 2-0 at home in what is now the National League. Mark Gower and Junior Agogo scored the goals and 1,144 spectators saw the action. Barnet finished the season just in the top half of the table, three points behind Rovers.

## 25 years ago (1999)

Barnet won 3-0 against Carlisle United at Underhill in the fourth tier. Darren Currie scored the first goal and Marlon King the other two. Darren Currie subsequently managed the Bees while Marlon King went on to play in the Premier League for Watford, Wigan Athletic, Hull City and Middlesbrough, and scored for Birmingham City against Barnet in the League Cup. The gate was 1,769. The Bees reached the play-offs at the end of the season, but lost out to Peterborough United at the two-legged, semi-final stage.

## 28 years ago (1996)

The Bees beat Doncaster Rovers 3-0 at home in the fourth tier. Sean Devine scored two of the goals and Phil Simpson the other. The crowd was 2,098. Barnet finished the season in 15th place.

## 33 years ago (1991)

Rochdale beat Barnet 1-0 at Spotland in the fourth tier. The gate was 3,033. The Bees made the play-offs at the end of what was their first season in the Football League, but lost to Blackpool over two legs. Rochdale finished two points behind Barnet.

## 53 years ago (1971)

Barnet won 5-1 at home against Stevenage Athletic in the Southern League Cup, second round. Colin Powell and Colin Flatt both scored a brace and Les Eason grabbed the other goal. The crowd was 759. Barnet had already beaten Gravesend & Northfleet (now Ebbsfleet United) over two legs in the first round, and went on to enjoy victories over Ramsgate Athletic and Bedford Town in the succeeding rounds, before meeting Hereford United in the two-legged final. The final ended 2-2 on aggregate and was replayed the following season, when Barnet won on penalties. By that time, Hereford had been elected to the Football League despite coming second in the Southern League (they replaced Barrow, incidentally, who were voted out despite not coming bottom).

# ...and currently

**The Bees' excellent 4-3 away win against Dagenham & Redbridge last Saturday saw Dean Brennan's men come back after being 3-1 down. It is the first time this season that the Bees have recovered from being two goals down.**

The previous occasion they achieved this was away to Dorking Wanderers last season, when the Bees went 2-0 behind but won 3-2. The comeback against the Daggers was the fourth time overall this season that Barnet have recovered after going behind to come back and win (Altrincham, Braintree Town and Boston United were the other games). The Dagenham game was also the first time they had come back to win away from home. Barnet have lost after leading on three occasions (Solihull Moors, York City and Exeter City, all away).

Nicke Kabamba's two penalty goals in the comeback against Dagenham takes him to nine goals in 12 games this season. Nicke is in second equal place among the National League's top goalscorers, behind Nick Haughton from AFC Fylde who is on 12. Nicke has scored one goal for every 95 minutes played in the league, which is better than anyone else in the league's top 20 scorers.

Barnet's run of nine home wins at the start of a season ended with the draw against Oldham Athletic in the most recent home game. It was the best run since 1963/64 (if a game against the Athenian League is included, and the best since the current club was formed in 1912 if that game is excluded).

The draw against Oldham also brought to an end Barnet's run of 21 games without a draw. It was the longest sequence without a draw since 2013/14.

Of course, Barnet's unbeaten home run continues, having now gone 10 matches without losing at home (nine league games). That equals the sequence at the start of last season when the Bees also went 10 home games unbeaten (again nine league games).

Anthony Hartigan, Nick Hayes and Myles Kenlock have played in (and started) all of Barnet's first team games this season. With Adebola Oluwo clocking up 50 games for the club against the Daggers, 10 current Barnet players have now passed that landmark.
